ADOT Bicyclist Safety Action Plan Committee

ADOT MPD has recently updated the Pedestrian Safety Action Plan. Next up is the ADOT Bicyclist Safety Action Plan Committee.

The proposed study would include: analysis of bicyclist crash data for the most recent five years available, identification of high crash locations, and, for this *planning-level study*, consideration of *potential* countermeasures to address identified problems. The study area is limited to all ADOT-maintained State highway right-of-way.

The Committee would meet up to five times over an eight month period. An email was sent out last month looking for volunteers, if you are interested in participating you can reach out to Michael Sanders, ADOT's Bicycle and Pedestrian Program Coordinator (MSanders@azdot.gov; 602-712-8141).

Arizona State Freight Plan

The Fixing America's Surface Transportation (Fast) Act includes a provision that requires each State that receives funding under the NHFP (National Highway Freight Program) to develop a State Freight Plan. This plan is to include a comprehensive plan for the immediate and long-range planning activities and investments of the State with respect to freight and should meet all required plan contents listed in the FAST Act.

The State Freight Plan requires the following to be included:

- Fiscally constrained
- Include a "Freight Investment Plan" with a list of priority projects
- Describe how the State will invest and match its NHFP (National Highway Freight Program) funds
- Cover a five-year forecast period

The estimated cost of identified freight improvement projects is almost \$6 billion and is far greater than the dedicated freight funds expected to be apportioned to Arizona under the FAST Act (\$117 million from 2016 – 2020).

ADOT contracted with CPCS in 2015 to assist in the development of a federally compliant Freight Plan. ADOT submitted the State Freight Plan to FHWA on September 29th for review (FHWA deadline is December 4, 2017). FHWA is currently reviewing the plan with a review time is 30 to 60 days.

Statewide Truck Parking Study

- Truck Parking Study is currently under way
- CPCS is the Consultant working with ADOT (located in Washington DC)
- The study kicked off on September 12 (Truck Parking Advisory Group met on Oct. 4)
- Truck parking is a national safety concern. Section 1401 of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP – 21), commonly referred to as “Jason’s Law,” was established to provide a “national priority on addressing the shortage of long-term parking for commercial motor vehicles on the National Highway System to improve the safety of motorized and non-motorized users and for commercial motor vehicle operators
- Jason’s Law makes safe parking for truck drivers a national priority in hopes of protecting other truckers from having to park in unsafe or poorly lit areas. In 2009, Jason Rivenburg was murdered in his truck in South Carolina while parking at an abandoned gas station 12 miles away from his destination. He was ahead of schedule and trucks are not allowed to show up at delivery sites early. There were no truck parking places close by. Jason had heard through the grapevine from other truckers this place was safe.
- CPCS will analyze the current truck parking conditions in AZ and provide us with a better understanding through the use of real time data and consultations as to where trucks are parking and how the new electronic logging device (ELD) requirement will impact the State starting on December 18, 2017.
- A lack of adequate truck parking often results in drivers stopping early, driving beyond their allowed HOS (Hours of Service), or negative truck parking behavior such as trucks parking on highway shoulders, ramps or on local surface streets. These parking behaviors can have a negative impact on highway safety, infrastructure condition and increase risk of safety and quality of life. Truck drivers often park in unauthorized / undesignated parking spaces several times per week.

- Study Objectives:
 - Assess current truck parking conditions and identify gaps between truck parking Supply and Demand
 - Define infrastructure and policy needs
 - Propose potential capacity and technology solutions

- Study Goals:
 - Provide background on current truck parking supply and demand
 - Identify factors affecting truck parking demand
 - Identify areas with truck parking needs and issues
 - Explore the potential for capacity and technology solutions
 - Identify next steps to address truck parking needs and integrate findings into the State Freight Plan

- Study to be done in 2 phases
 - Phase 1 to be completed in December 2017
 - Phase 2 to be completed in April 2018

(P2P) Planning to Programming

P2P District Workshops #2 are currently underway. Regional Planners are facilitating discussions between ADOT Technical Groups in Phoenix with ADOT District Staff to review all project lists submitted by ADOT Technical Groups (Pavement Preservation, Bridge Preservation, Modernization, and Expansion) for inclusion in the FY19 – FY2023 Draft Five Year Program.

We are updating project details (project limits, names, etc.) combining projects where appropriate, and adding District comments & concerns. (Ex. Project limits are I-17 between MP 77 and 87; section between MP 80 & MP 82 needs a full reconstruction and the other areas need spot repairs)

Project Management Review (PMDR)

The ADOT LPA section sent out a memo via email on October 12th. The memo outlines 2 changes taking place:

PMDR is being renamed Project Development Administration (PDA)

As of October 2017 design reviews will be conducted by an outsourced team of consultants rather than ADOT staff. (The consultants will be housed onsite in the Phoenix ADOT offices.) PDA reviews will be conducted as Compliance Reviews rather than Quality Reviews. The PDA reviewers will simply be looking to see if the design plans meet requirements and standards.

LPA's and their consultants will need to submit design plans that meet standards. Any design plans that do not meet standards will be sent back to the LPA for re-work. An in-depth review will be conducted on a "sample portion" of projects.

This will apply to all projects that ADOT administers. HURF Exchange projects are excluded from PDA.

Please ensure you program PDA costs into federally funded projects.

Pinal Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) - Agenda Item #8

- Pinal RTA Board of Directors approved the Regional Transportation Plan on June 5, 2017 and requested by resolution that the Board of Supervisors conduct an election to approve the regional transportation plan and related transportation excise tax.
- On June 21, 2017, the Pinal County Board of Supervisors ordered and called for the election to be held on November 7, 2017.
