Subject: ADOT MPD Report

- **1. FY25-29 Five Year Construction Program:** The Draft FY25-29 Five Year Construction Program was presented to the Arizona State Transportation Board on 2/16/24. STB comments were incorporated, and the public comment period has begun that will conclude on May 24th, 2024. Please make sure to include your comments on projects, as selection of projects are not guaranteed. The public hearing for the STB will be on May 17th, which will then go to the board for adoption on June 21st.
- **2. TA Program:** TA project initiation work has begun with identifying planning types of studies and projects that are more suited for design and following the typical ADOT LPA authorization process. I've been supplying SCMPO the Federal Authorization details for the letters to be submitted to ADOT MPD finance. Please continue to visit the program website for needed information: <a href="https://activetransportation.az.gov/transportation-alternatives-program">https://activetransportation.az.gov/transportation-alternatives-program</a>.
- **3. HSIP Call for projects SFY27/28:** The HSIP call for projects was released on January 4th, 2024. An information webinar occurred January 18th, and applications will be due on May 3rd. - **4. Off System Bridge Program:** ADOT LPA sent eligibility letters out with the project initiation documentation requirements. IGAS cannot be completed before the end of FY24, and please submit the revised LPA initiation work to FY25.
- **4. ADOT SMART Program:** Please continue to work with your local agencies to submit any applications for the SMART program. The website continues to be host of useful information found at <a href="https://azdot.gov/planning/grant-coordination/az-smart-fund">https://azdot.gov/planning/grant-coordination/az-smart-fund</a>.
- **5**. **Federal Discretionary Grants:** Please continue to visit USDOT's website or the ADOT grant coordination page <a href="https://azdot.gov/planning/adot-grant-coordination-group">https://azdot.gov/planning/adot-grant-coordination-group</a> for the NOFOs and deadlines.

### Status of ADOT studies:

1. **Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan:** ADOT is conducting RFPs to construct chargers along the interstate freeways; it is anticipated for awards to occur in early summer of 2024. ADOT held a virtual pre-proposal conference during the week of February 23rd, and this recorded webinar can be found on the NEVI site. The proposal's due date was April 19th,

2024. The next release of RFPs for the next round of corridors will be at the end of 2024. ADOT is currently evaluating additional NHS corridors for this year's NEVI plan update. - 2. **Statewide ITS Architecture Update:** Mid-tier deliverables have been received from the consultant regarding inventories and technical information, and comments have been provided by the stakeholders. We are moving forward with final deliverables and aiming to complete the project in May.
- 5. Many other studies are also occurring including freight, State Highway-Rail Grade Crossing Action Plan, PHX-TUC FRA Rail Corridor Identification and development, district corridor studies, and numerous transportation alternative studies.

### FHWA PLANNING UPDATES FOR APRIL 2024

### U.S. District Court Vacates FHWA's Final Rule for the GHG Emissions Performance Measure

On March 27, 2024, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas <u>vacated and remanded</u> the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA's) final rule for the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions performance measure [88 FR 85364], in effect nullifying the rule Nationwide. Consistent with the Court's decision, States and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are not required to submit initial targets and reports at this time. FHWA will provide more information soon.

### President Approves Fiscal Year 2024 Appropriations Through September 30, 2024

On March 9, 2024, the President signed a consolidated appropriations act to approve appropriations for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 through September 30, 2024. The departments, agencies, and activities funded in the bill include the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), the U.S. Department of Energy, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the Environmental Protection Agency.

### U.S. DOT Announces \$3.3 Billion in Awards for Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods

On March 13, 2024, the U.S. DOT <u>announced</u> more than \$3.3 billion in awards from the <u>Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (RCN) Grant Program</u>. The RCN Grant Program combines funding from the <u>Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program</u> and the <u>Neighborhood Access and Equity Grant Program</u>. In this round of funding for the RCN Grant Program, the Department awarded 72 planning grants, 52 capital construction grants, and 8 regional planning grants. ### U.S. DOT Announces \$54 Million in Awards for SMART Grants Program

On March 14, 2024, the U.S. DOT <u>announced</u> \$54 million in awards from the Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grants Program. The Department issued grant awards for 34 projects across 22 States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. More information is available <u>here</u>.

### **USDOT** Announces \$5.1 Billion in Available Funding for Multimodal Project Discretionary Grants

On March 28, 2024, the U.S. DOT <u>announced</u> the availability of more than \$5.1 billion in combined funding for the Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant (MPDG) Program. Available funding includes \$1.7 billion for the <u>National Infrastructure Project Assistance (Mega) Program</u>, \$2.7 billion for the <u>Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) Program</u>, and \$780 million for the <u>Rural Surface Transportation Grant (Rural) Program</u>. Applicants that wish to submit the same application to be considered for more than one grant under the MPDG Program only need to submit their application through one <u>Grants.gov</u> opportunity number (<u>NIPA-25-26-MEGA</u>, <u>NSMFHP-25-26-INFRA</u>, or <u>RSTGP-25-26-RURAL</u>), and that application will be considered for all programs for which it is not opted-out or ineligible. The application deadline is May 6, 2024.

### U.S. DOT Announces \$57 Million in Available Funding for Innovative Finance and Asset Concession

On March 11, 2024, the U.S. DOT <u>announced</u> the availability of \$57 million in funding through the <u>Innovative Finance</u> <u>and Asset Concession Grant Program</u>. Technical Assistance Grants are available to help recipients build organizational capacity and advance a portfolio of assets by conducting pre-construction tasks, such as asset scans, value-for-money analyses, and other tasks that consider innovative finance and delivery, including asset concessions. Expert Services Grants are available to help enable recipients to hire expert professionals to develop and deliver public-private partnerships in connection with the development of a specific asset. The application deadline is May 10, 2024. More information is available <u>here</u>.

### FHWA Announces \$1.2 Billion in Available Funding for Low Carbon Transportation Materials

On March 12, 2024, FHWA <u>announced</u> the availability of \$1.2 billion in funding through the <u>Low Carbon Transportation</u> <u>Materials (LCTM) Grant Program</u>. The LCTM Grant Program focuses on accelerating the use of materials and products that have lower levels of embodied greenhouse gas emissions on eligible projects funded under Title 23. This LCTM funding is available to State DOTs (including the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico) through a <u>Request for Applications</u>

(RFA) that closes June 10, 2024. Later this year FHWA will also make available \$800 million to target non-state applicants through a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO).

### FHWA Announces \$44.5 Million in Available Funding for Active Transportation Infrastructure

On March 19, 2024, FHWA <u>announced</u> the availability of \$44.5 million in funding through the <u>Active Transportation</u> <u>Infrastructure Investment Program (ATIIP)</u>. FHWA will award Planning and Design Grants for eligible applicants to develop plans for active transportation networks and active transportation spines. FHWA will award Construction Grants to eligible applicants to construct projects to provide safe and connected active transportation facilities in an active transportation network or active transportation spine. The application deadline is June 17, 2024. More information is available here.

### FHWA Announces \$45 Million in Available Funding for Strategic Innovation for Revenue Collection

On March 27, 2024, FHWA <u>announced</u> the availability of \$45 million in funding through the <u>Strategic Innovation for Revenue Collection (SIRC) Program</u>. The purpose of the SIRC Program is to provide grants to eligible entities to test the feasibility of a road usage fee and other user-based alternative revenue mechanisms to help maintain the long-term solvency of the Highway Trust Fund through pilot projects at the State, local, and regional level. The application deadline is May 27, 2024.

### 1. March 25 Board Meeting

- Approved two IGAs: 1) TPT Tax Refunds pertaining to the invalid tax (County is taking then lead on the refunds, with ADOR support – PRTA is not involved administratively which is acknowledged in the approved IGA); and 2) Cooperative Services IGA outlines in greater detail the resources and services the County is providing to the PRTA to develop a new Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).
- Other Notable Acton Items:
  - Approved FY24/25 Budget for PRTA: \$1,560,000 (includes all administrative, consultant, election related expenses)
  - Approved the Guiding Principles, Project Evaluation and Selection Criteria for developing new RTP. Board approval triggered the start of Call for Projects which began on April 4 with a deadline of May 30.
  - Approved Resolution, supporting MAG Regional Transportation Plan. This was an item that Chairman McFarland initiated. Board recognized the importance of the connectedness of the MAG plan and Pinal's transportation system and approved it unanimously.
