Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) Update (Information Only):

Pinal County Safety Plan/SCMPO Network Screening Crash and Analysis Tools Update

• RTAC Priority Project List - Presentations

Duane was unable to attend. The following updates were provided.

Pinal County Safety Plan/SCMPO Network Screening Crash and Analysis Tools Update - David Harmon stated that the first round of Public Outreach meetings is complete. The Public Outreach webpage will have the survey and mapping exercises open until July 31, 2024. As of June 26th, there have been 392 surveys in English and 1 survey in Spanish completed (+205 since last EB update). There have been 192 Social Pinpoint Mapping exercises completed (+106 since last EB update). The consultant submitted the Network Screening Methodology memo and is under internal review before being released to study stakeholders. Work on crash data analysis and equity analysis continues. The consultant is working on the safety plan prioritization, development and implementation memorandums. The Draft Plan is expected in early August.

RTAC Priority Project List - Presentation - Irene Higgs stated that the RTAC Board decided to submit another Greater Arizona Priority Project Legislation Bill this next session. The request for possible inclusion in the State budget will \$480M total/this includes a 20% inflation factor. \$32,441,189 total for the Sun Corridor Region/\$8.1 million per member agency. This request for our region equates to 37 years' worth of funding. Based on the last RTP, there is \$1.5B in unmet transportation needs just for the MPO region.

The following projects were presented:

Casa Grande - Monir Zaman, Traffic Engineer, presented the Freight Corridor Roadway Improvements projects, which include improvements at Thornton Rd/Cottonwood Lane and Terkel Rd/Jimmie Kerr Blvd. Total Project cost \$10,410,297.

Coolidge - Ben Navarro, Public Works Director, presented the City of Coolidge and Pinal County Procter and Gamble Roadway Improvement projects. The roadway improvements include Arica Rd, Shedd Rd and Vail Rd. Total cost of project is \$17,203,432.

Eloy - Matt Rencher, Public Works Director, presented the Houser Road Between La Palma Road and Eleven Mile Corner Road roadway improvement project. The project will construct 2 miles of paved 2 lane roadway. Total cost of project \$8,110,297.

# 6 Air Quality (AQ) Update (Information Only)

Jason Bottien provided the following update for Pinal County:

SCMPO Winter 2023 Air Quality Conformity - The 30-day public comment period ran from May 2, 2024 through June 1, 2024. No public comments were received. The associated conformity analysis & air quality TIP amendment were approved by the SCMPO Executive Board on June 11, 2024. A request for a Finding of Conformity was sent to the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration on June 17th. Once the Finding of Conformity is received, The Air Quality TIP Amendment approved by the SCMPO EB on June 11, 2024 will be submitted to ADOT.

SCMPO Spring 2024 Air Quality Conformity - MAG is currently working on the Conformity Analysis for this round. The approval of the Air Quality project list and associated 30-day public comment period is on today's consent agenda. The public comment period is scheduled for August 22, 2024 to September 21, 2024.

# 7 Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) Planner Update (Information Only)

Will Randolph provided the following update:

FY25-29 Five Year Construction Program: The Draft FY25-29 Five Year Construction Program was presented to the Arizona State Transportation Board on 2/16/24. STB comments were incorporated, and the public comment concluded May 24th, 2024. The public hearing for the STB was on May 17th, then went towards a study session on June 6th and was Adopted June 21st.

Transportation Alternative Program(TA): TA project initiation work is mostly completed with various planning types of studies and design projects. The two Safe Routes to School Studies for Case Grande and Coolidge are being administered by Sun Corridor. Please continue to visit the program website for needed information: https://activetransportation.az.gov/transportation-alternatives-program.

Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) - The HSIP applications were due May 3rd. Applications will be vetted through the internal ADOT processes for approval and the STB approving the initial list July 19th, and local agencies will be informed in July to submit their project initiation paperwork that will be due in August. ADOT Safety Plan (SHAP) and Active Transportation Safety Action Plan (ATSAP): In person public participation meetings and the virtual session concluded May 9th, this recording will eventually become available on the public website for the studies. The public comment period ended May 17th through the public website. The technical advisory workshops have concluded as well. https://azdot.gov/arizona-highway-safety-plan-shsp-active-transportation-safety-action-plan-atsap

Off System Bridge Programs: ADOT LPA sent eligibility letters out with the project initiation documentation requirements. IGAS cannot be completed before the end of FY24, and the City of Coolidge has sent in the Casa Grande Canal Extension Bridge revised FY25 project initiation documents.

SMART Fund - Please continue to work with your local agencies to submit any applications for the SMART program. The website continues to be host of useful information found at https://azdot.gov/planning/grant-coordination/az-smart-fund.

Federal Discretionary Grants: Please continue to visit USDOT's website or the ADOT grant coordination page https://azdot.gov/planning/adot-grant-coordination-group for the NOFOs and deadlines.

Statewide ITS Architecture Update: Deliverables and the final plan have been completed with appendices. Stakeholder comments have been provided regarding the final plan and the plan documents and RAD-IT Architecture have been loaded on the ADOT website.

Other studies: A RFP has been recently released to the ADOT on-call consultants for studying and looking at planning level recommendations for the SR corridors 87 and 287. Proposals will be due to ADOT July 31st. Other studies are also occurring including freight, a State Highway-Rail Grade Crossing Action Plan, PHX-TUC FRA Rail Corridor Identification and development, district corridor profile studies, and numerous transportation alternative studies.

# 8 Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) Update (Information Only)

Romare Truely provided the following update

U.S. DOT Issues Policy Statement on Reducing Negative Impacts of Projects on EJ Communities
On June 20, 2024, the Secretary of Transportation issued a "Policy Statement on Reducing Negative Impacts of Transportation Projects on Communities with Environmental Justice Concerns (Including Disadvantaged Communities and Communities with Significant Transportation Insecurities)." This policy statement confirms the commitment from the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) to both increase benefits and reduce harms experienced by communities with environmental justice (EJ) concerns

# U.S. DOT Announces \$1.8 Billion in Awards for the RAISE Program

On June 26, 2024, the U.S. DOT announced \$1.8 billion in awards for the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) discretionary grants program. The Department announced grant awards for 148 projects in urban and rural areas across the country, including historically disadvantaged areas and areas of persistent poverty.

FHWA Announces \$108 Million in Awards to Improve Transportation on Federal and Tribal Lands
On June 18, 2024, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) announced over \$108 million in awards from the Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects (NSFLTP) Program and the Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund (TTPSF) Program. FHWA announced \$88.2 million in NSFLTP grants for 5 projects, and \$20.5 million in TTPSF grants for 80 projects.

# FHWA Announces \$60 Million in Awards for Vehicle-to-Everything Technologies

On June 20, 2024, FHWA announced nearly \$60 million in awards from the Saving Lives with Connectivity: Accelerating Vehicle to Everything (V2X) Deployment Program. The grants to recipients in Arizona, Texas, and Utah will serve as national models to advance connected and interoperable vehicle technologies and new deployments of V2X technologies.

#### FTA Announces \$7.8 Million in Awards for Access and Mobility Pilot Program

On June 6, 2024, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) announced \$7.8 million in awards from the Innovative Coordinated Access and Mobility (ICAM) Pilot Program for 17 projects in 15 States. The ICAM Pilot Program provides competitive funding to support innovative projects for the transportation disadvantaged that will improve the coordination of transportation services and non-emergency medical transportation services.

# FHWA Announces \$227 Million in Available Funding for Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program

On June 6, 2024, FHWA published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to announce the availability of \$227 million in funding through the Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program (WCPP) for Fiscal Years (FY) 2024-2026. The WCPP provide grants on a competitive basis for projects that seek to achieve a reduction in the number of wildlife-vehicle collisions and improve habitat connectivity for terrestrial and aquatic species. The application deadline for FY 2024 and FY 2025 is September 4, 2024. The application period for FY 2026 will open May 1, 2025 and close August 1, 2025.

# FTA Announces \$1.9 Million in Available Funding for Enhancing Mobility Innovation Program

On July 1, 2024, FTA published a NOFO to announce the availability of \$1.9 million in funding through the Enhancing Mobility Innovation (EMI) Program. Funding is available for projects to accelerate innovations that improve mobility and enhance the rider experience with a focus on innovative service delivery models, creative financing, novel partnerships, and integrated payment solutions, and for projects to develop software solutions that facilitate the provision of integrated demand-response public transportation service that dispatches public transportation fleet vehicles through riders' mobile devices or other means. The application deadline is August 30, 2024.

# FHWA Accepting First Applications for Transportation Access Pilot Program

On April 16, 2024, FHWA announced the first application period for the Transportation Access Pilot Program. This first round seeks to identify transportation agencies that are currently working on, or are soon planning to start, transportation accessibility analysis studies. Letters of interest are due by June 7, 2024 to be considered for the first round of the pilot program.
