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



Subject: ADOT MPD Report

1. FY25-29 Five Year Construction Program: Projects have been reviewed and determined for priority ranking in the P2P for FY 26-30 P2P cycle. PLS meetings will be moving forward in November before establishing the tentative program.

2. TA Program: The two Safe Routes to School Studies for Case Grande and Coolidge are being administered by Sun Corridor. The NTP will be given to the consultant for the Casa Grande Study in mid_November, and the consultant was selected for the Coolidge study and finalizing the contract with an anticipated NTP soon after. 3. Off System Bridge Program (OSB): The call for projects was released for SFY 26. There will continue to be two separate funding programs available for use on off-system bridge projects, the STBG program with 5.7% percent match and the Bridge Formula Program which is 100% federally funded. Applications will be due to ADOT LPA 12/30, with application reviewed in January, and eligibility determined in February. The Purpose of the Off-System Bridge Program is to fund the Design and/or Construction for replacement, rehabilitation, preservation and protection of roadway bridges over waterways, other topographical barriers, other roadways, railroads, canals, ferry landings, etc. on bridges that are not on the Federal-aid highway system (local roads or rural minor collectors).

4. ADOT SMART Program: Updates were done to the Request for Grant Application and Agreement (RFGAA). Comments were accepted from stakeholders and changes were implemented and approved recently by the STB. The next year will be a pilot program of the new SMART program with applications accepted 11/1, which will tentatively go to the PPAC and the Board in January. 5. Federal Discretionary Grants: Please continue to visit USDOT's website or the ADOT grant coordination page <u>https://azdot.gov/planning/adot-grant-coordination-group</u> for the NOFOs and deadlines.

Status of ADOT studies:

1. 287/87 SR Corridor Profile Study: The project had its kickoff with the TAC on 9/24. Tribal outreach was conducted to GRIC and other tribes in the area. The study is in the early stages of gathering existing information and analyzing current performance data. The

consultant is collecting information from cooperating agencies and the next major meetings to occur will be with South Central District and the next TAC meeting in early December.

2. Passenger Rail Study: Step 1 of the FRA approved study process is continuing into next year with developing the scope and budget. FRA approved of the Project Management Plan and is currently reviewing the gap analysis for scoping. This Step 1 process is looking to complete in April of 2025, with then moving into Step 2 of the study.

3. N/S Corridor Tier 2 Study: The kickoff occurred in September, is coordinating with the passenger rail and SR 287/87 studies, has initiated its public involvement plan, is initiating right-of-entry permitting and aerial mapping efforts, and will continue to have bi-weekly core team meetings. 4. Other studies are also occurring including freight, a State Highway-Rail Grade Crossing Action Plan, and numerous transportation alternative studies.

Papoose Road and Surrounding Road (Kiva Rd/Trading Post Rd) Starting to build up the dirt roads and will chip seal Spring 2025

Vekol Wash on Ralston Constructing an all-weather crossing on Ralston Road across Vekol Wash in Hidden Valley. Design is almost complete and project will go out for bid in January.

Pavement Preservation: (Chip Seal) This week 10/28-10/31 Jimmie Kerr Blvd: Earley Road to Broken Spoke Montgomery Road: Ash Avenue to I-8

1. PRTA and Regional Transportation Plan Development Updates:

- PRTA Staff recommends and TTAC Approved at their Oct. 29 meeting, <u>a suspension of</u> <u>developing a new Regional Transportation Plan.</u>
- Suspension of the RTP is based on the lack of revenues to cover the costs for implementing the region's priority projects.
- Bond financing was considered to lessen the need for non-PRTA funds, but the costs for bond financing need to be covered by lower than anticipated revenues for the 20-year program creating a funding gap from non-PRTA revenues ranging from \$105m to \$174m.
- TTAC also forwarded comments to the PRTA Board about the <u>option to develop a long-range</u> <u>transportation framework study</u> identifying the needs of the region over potentially a 50-year (or longer) timeline.
- The consensus of the TTAC was favorable to consider moving forward on a long-range study at some point in the future, led by the region's stakeholders. Members expressed support to identify the aggregate needs of the entire county and its critical connected sub-regions with key regional transportation and economic corridors.
- Members of the TTAC expressed interest on determining funding to develop a long-range framework study, recognizing the costs could be substantial (\$500k to \$1m, depending on elements included in the plan).
- Additionally, TTAC commented on the timing to begin a framework study as recommended by staff in the fall of 2025.
- Further discussion also included the need for regional collaboration and who would be the primary lead agencies in developing the study. It was noted the PRTA does not currently have the legal authority to do such a plan as their statutory authority is limited to developing an RTP, identifying funding, and implementing the plan.
- Action on a long-range framework study would likely take place among Sun Corridor, CAG, MAG, the County and the cities and towns.
- If the Board approves the TTAC recommendation to suspend the RTP efforts, then the PRTA would also suspend its activities after the Nov. 12 Board meeting. There are no future TTAC meetings scheduled.
